Dear Parents/Carer,

Re: Confirmation of critical worker status

Late last night the Government announced the list of workers who are considered to be critical to the fight against COVID-19. If a parent works within one of these critical sectors they are entitled to ask schools to provide care for their children.

Yesterday, we sent out information with a list of possible key workers that was incomplete. I would ask you to disregard the previous letter and work from this updated information.

Guidance for parents

Parents whose work is critical to the COVID-19 response include those who work in health and social care and in other key sectors outlined below. Many parents working in these sectors may be able to ensure their child is kept at home. And every child who can be safely cared for at home should be.

Please, therefore, follow these key principles:

- 1. If it is at all possible for children to be at home, then they should be.
- 2. If a child needs specialist support, is vulnerable or has a parent who is a critical worker, then educational provision will be available for them.
- Parents should not rely for childcare upon those who are advised to be in the stringent social distancing category such as grandparents, friends, or family members with underlying conditions.
- 4. Parents should also do everything they can to ensure children are not mixing socially in a way which can continue to spread the virus. They should observe the same social distancing principles as adults.
- 5. Residential special schools, boarding schools and special settings continue to care for children wherever possible.

We appreciate this is a very difficult and worrying time for everyone, and we appreciate your support and patience as we work through all the details.

and social care staff including volunteers; the support and specialist		
staff required to maintain the UK's health and social care sector;		
those working as part of the health and social care supply chain,

personal protective equipment.		
Education and childcare		
This includes nursery and teaching staff, social workers and those		
specialist education professionals who must remain active during the		
COVID-19 response to deliver this approach.		
Key public services		
This includes those essential to the running of the justice system,		
religious staff, charities and workers delivering key frontline services,		
those responsible for the management of the deceased, and		
journalists and broadcasters who are providing public service		
broadcasting.		
Local and national government		
This only includes those administrative occupations essential to the		
effective delivery of the COVID-19 response or delivering essential		
public services such as the payment of benefits, including in		
government agencies and arms length bodies.		
Food and other necessary goods		
This includes those involved in food production, processing,		
distribution, sale and delivery as well as those essential to the		
provision of other key goods (for example hygienic and veterinary		
medicines).		
Public safety and national security		
This includes police and support staff, Ministry of Defence civilians,		
contractor and armed forces personnel (those critical to the delivery		
of key defence and national security outputs and essential to the		
response to the COVID-19 pandemic), fire and rescue service		
employees (including support staff), National Crime Agency staff,		
those maintaining border security, prison and probation staff and		
other national security roles, including those overseas.		
Transport		
This includes those who will keep the air, water, road and rail		
passenger and freight transport modes operating during the COVID-		
19 response, including those working on transport systems through		
which supply chains pass.		
Utilities, communication and financial services		

This includes staff needed for essential financial services provision (including but not limited to workers in banks, building societies and financial market infrastructure), the oil, gas, electricity and water sectors (including sewerage), information technology and data	Key Worker Sector	Parent 1	Parent 2
