Reading intervention( Two days per week)	Children who are in danger of falling behind will access a comprehensive reading recovery programme.
One to One tuition	Children will be able to work through areas of misunderstanding in maths and literacy. A highly trained and experienced teacher will deliver focussed intervention that will ensure FSM children have the same opportunities as other children in reaching their full potential.
Booster Class for Y6	Y6 children will consolidate their knowledge in small groups with a highly trained intervention teacher. This will ensure that any gaps in knowledge can be addressed quickly and children will be able to reach their full potential.
