Message from Mrs Macdonald - Head Teacher

What wet and wild week we have had! Many thanks to those of you who have made sure children have coats and waterproof shoes - we like to get the children out to play if possible, so having these items means they can get out even if it's a bit damp.

It has come up in a recent survey that some children do not always feel that good behaviour is recognised at MBHS, so I will be working with Pupil Parliament to make sure this is rectified. The first step will be a reminder for all pupils about the recognition they **could** get for behaving well, such as a headteacher award (star of the week), a golden ticket for good lunchtime behaviour or merit points to recognise behaviour for learning. We will also be launching school leadership roles for pupils, and nominating children who always reflect our school values. This will include play leader roles and the appointment of librarians; Laila and Ivy (Y5) are the first two pupils to be awarded this role this week. As a reminder for all pupils and parents, we are also sending out our behaviour policy for you to review with your children - please do encourage them to always try their best and behave well

As always, we have a lot of wonderful things coming up this term (we have already crammed in a Y6 trip to Eden!) - please keep dates in your diary for key events. We are particularly excited for a week of science learning this term (British Science Week 8 - 17 March) and our careers focus, culminating in a careers fayre on Thursday the 28th March. We will send out all key dates and information via newsletter, flyer and on our social media feed.







Pupil Voice - Our Learning This Week

<p>Nursery</p>	<p>In Pre-school we enjoyed the story "A Seed In Need". The children learnt about what a seed needs to grow and enjoyed talking about this during group times. Our pre-school children remembered about using water cans to water our flowers/vegetables in the Pre-school garden.</p> <p>We enjoyed getting creative making ladybirds and beautiful sunflowers using various resources. <p>Reception</p>	<p>What an exciting week in Reception, we have started our new theme; 'Our Ocean City' and the children have been great researchers. We have been talking about Plymouth as an Ocean City and all of the creatures that can be found in Plymouth Sound. <p>Year 1</p>	<p>In Year 1 this week we have been very excited to learn all about explorers in History. We have learned about the equipment needed to be explorers and we have also heard how brave Robert Falcon Scott was during his expeditions to the Antarctic. <p>Year 2</p>	<p>This week, Year 2 have been exploring circuits in PE. They had a jump ladder, sprint test, throwing and catching practice and a bean bag toss. In teams of 5, they each had a go at all 4 activities. Each different activity had a different skill focus. We explored supporting each team member by cheering them on and we got to show some real strengths individually.</p> 
<p>Year 3</p>	<p>Year 3 have been getting stuck into their new topics after a lovely first week back. We have begun our new geography topic on the countries in our world, and have been researching the answers to the questions we have about different countries' capital cities, landmarks and physical features. We've also started our new DT topic, where we will be leading up to design our own pasta dish! And in our Writing sessions, we've been studying the story of 'Leon and the Place Between', and have done a little acting to help us better understand the story.</p>
<p>Year 4</p>	<p>In English, Year 4 have been exploring the classic text, 'Wind in the Willows'.</p> <p>Today, the class watched a film version of the text, and then re-enacted small sections.</p> 
<p>Year 5</p>	<p>Welcome back everyone and what a return it's been. We got straight to business and made an absolutely amazing Viking village showing off our ever increasing DT skills (structures and reinforcements) and our in depth understanding of how Vikings lived.</p> <p>The results are astounding. They all did brilliantly and no doubt some of your homes will be furnished with some great models shortly.</p>

We now start a whole raft of new units across the board looking at an overarching theme of the Alps. I look forward to sharing our learning over the next 5 weeks.



Year 6

Year 6 were privileged to visit the incredible Eden Project this week, where we learned about where the food in our lunch boxes comes from and how plants are integral to our very survival. We learned about how Fair Trade products benefit farmers and workers across the world and how we can act in a sustainable way to protect our planet.
