Widening Horizons - Nethercott Farm Residential Trip

As you know, Millfields Inspired funds trips throughout the year for the Year 5 children to attend various Widening Horizons activities. All of these trips are planned to give the children a taste for the world of work, inspiring them by taking them out of the classroom into lots of different places of work, such as Plymouth Citybus, Mayflower Marina, Peninsula Dental and Medical Schools, Brittany Ferries and City College Plymouth, to name a few. This is all made possible from funds donated to the charity from the Millfields Trust.

This year, we have been very fortunate to raise some extra funds from Persimmon Homes, Devon Community Foundation, Bank of England, Howdens Joinery, Stonehouse Boat Owners Association, Local Councillors, Drew & Co and DCH Group which has enabled us to look at doing something a little different.

We have been working with Farms for City Children, a charity which runs week-long residential trips at Nethercott House in North Devon, where children get involved in all aspects of farm and country life alongside real working farmers. This is a wonderful opportunity for the children to experience life on a farm where they will be caring for cows, sheep, pigs, donkeys, a horse and pony, chickens, ducks and turkeys. During their stay the children take part in a carefully supervised schedule, involving feeding, grooming and rearing the animals, working in the vegetable garden, cooking, woodland activities, a village walk and other seasonal activities.

This is a one-off opportunity to have a week-long residential for your child which has been paid for completely. High Street school may ask for a contribution towards the cost of the coach, as this has not been covered by us.

The children will have a most amazing time, so I urge you to accept this offer.

More detailed information will be made available to you from school; I just wanted to explain the background of where this offer has come from.
